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# Parent Support Advisor

As we get further into summer (allegedly!) the lighter evenings often mean that our older children are out and about on their bikes and with their friends. Our Year 6's are also starting to think about the walk to their new secondary school in September and with this in mind we have arranged for a Truck and Child safety demonstration to come into school next week, to highlight the dangers large vehicles can pose to pedestrians and cyclists. We are fortunate that DHL are bringing a very large lorry into the car park and every class will get a short workshop around road safety. They will be with us on Monday and Wednesday, and we will make sure that our Year 6's have their session on Monday as some have their secondary school inductions on Wednesday. This does also mean that if you are late into school for any reason on either of those days, you will not be able to access the school car park.



#### The Haven Pantry

Our affordable food club, the Haven Pantry, is changing times from June 4th, 2024 and is available at The Haven, Queens Drive, Swindon SN3 every Tuesday from 2.30pm -

Our pantry enables you and your household access to nutritious food for a fraction of what these items would cost at a supermarket (2/3 cheaper than the supermarket or more!). You can pick up fresh fruit, vegetables, salad, bread, cake, chilled and a frozen item (depending on availability) for free. All you need to do is pay the six-month membership fee and then exchange cash for points if you would like to, for all the other subsidised items.

#### Membership

Each household will pay £1 per person, per household for a six-month registration period. (e.g., 4 members in a household will cost £4 for 6 months) and complete a very short registration form. Proof of income or benefit will be required. Max £22,000 income per household, but chat to us if you are struggling and don't fit these criteria or have no access to any funds (Organisations across Swindon can also refer).

Once you become a member, this allows you to exchange cash for points when you visit (£1 equals 4 points) in addition to the free items. Members enter the shopping area and choose items to the value of the points purchased. The items are then taken to the till and any unused points will be carried over to the next visit. By offering a points credit system, it allows member to purchase points in bulk when paid (maximum £20) and then return to shop throughout the month when required.

The funds raised will allow us to reinvest in a consistent supply of foods we normally struggle to provide such as coffee, sugar, toiletries, cheese etc. All items will be subject

This week I have also been made aware of a new affordable food club that has been set up in Swindon.

The Haven on Queens Drive (opposite Burger King) is home to the Haven Pantry and is available to families on benefits or a low income (less than £22,000 per year) although I understand there is some flexibility on this. Membership is £1 per family member for 6 months, and once you have joined you can use their points system to buy nutritious food at a fraction of the supermarket cost.

It is open on Tuesdays from 2.30-4pm - I have attached their information leaflet, should you be interested!

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## Safeguarding

## Modern Slavery

This week our safeguarding focus is on modern slavery and trafficking.

Slavery is defined as 'when an individual is exploited by others for personal or commercial gain and as a result they lose their freedom'. This includes activities such as forced labour (any work someone is forced to do against their will, or under threat of punishment), criminal exploitation (being forced to take part in criminal activity, including county lines), sexual exploitation, human trafficking and child slavery.

Modern slavery is present in every part of the UK and in many forms - it is estimated that over 100,000 people in the UK are victims of modern slavery.

In 2021, of all the potential victims reported to the police, 43% were children and 31% were British nationals. Anyone can be a target for modern slavery but some people can be more at risk because of money, social or health issues or because of their age or immigration status. Victims might look helpless and afraid, but they can also seem to accept their situation, be completely unaware of it or even defend the people that are exploiting them. You might even see people trapped in slavery without knowing it. It might be someone working in a private home on your street; the man working in the car wash; or the cleaner who empties your office bin every night.

It can be difficult to spot the signs, but if you are concerned about someone, or would like more information please see <a href="https://www.modernslaveryhelpline.org">www.modernslaveryhelpline.org</a> or call 101 to report your concerns.
