Purple Mash

As part of our topic work, we will be learning ‘Where in the World is India?’ All children have their Purple Mash log in details in their reading records. Once logged on, click on 2Do and complete **one or all** of the activities below.

Sari, Sherwani or Salwar Kameez: Design your own Sari, Sherwani or Salwar Kameez to wear to a celebration or festival – you could design one for a friend or family member.

Write a postcard: Imagine you are visiting the city of Mumbai. Can you write a postcard about your experiences of Mumbai?

Fruit pictogram: Who is the fruit monster in your home? Children will be set the challenge of investigating, which fruit is the favourite out of: apples, bananas, grapes, kiwis, pears and strawberries. They will need to record their findings by inputting this data onto the pictogram to find out which fruit is the most popular.

Tiger lifecycle: Can you write about the lifecycle of a tiger? Research about the different stages of a tiger’s life (infant, child, young adult, adult) and write about them.
