Your child's attendance at school is important and mandatory.

We are receiving a high number of absence requests from parents and many of these are for visiting a relative who is unwell. Lots of these requests are for days/weeks added to the beginning or end of a term. Can I please remind you that absences in term time can only be authorised in 'exceptional circumstances' listed in a guidance I follow from Swindon Borough Council (SBC). Visiting an unwell relative abroad would not usually constitute an exceptional circumstance. However, each request will be considered on an individual basis but will generally not be approved. Flight prices can never be taken into consideration.

SBC can give each parent a fine of £80, which rises to £160 each if you do not pay within 21 days. If you do not pay the fine after 28 days you may be prosecuted for your child's absence from school.

Please help us to ensure your child's education is not impacted negatively by absences for holidays taken in term time.

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

LEAVING CHILDREN HOME ALONE

Being a parent is a demanding, 24 hour a day job. Parents are under so many pressures, it is not surprising that many find it hard to cope. Most parents have to spend some time away from their children, whether it is to go to work or out for the evening. It can be hard to find someone suitable to look after a child, and it can also be expensive. But children rely on adults to protect them and parents are responsible for making sure that their children are happy and well looked after in their absence.

What does the law say?

The law does not say an age when you can leave a child on their own, but it's an offence to leave a child alone if it places them at risk. Parents can be prosecuted if they leave a child unsupervised 'in a manner likely to cause unnecessary suffering or injury to health'. If your child has an older sibling, you might feel you can leave them home together, especially if one child is older. There's no legal age a child can babysit – but if you leave your children with someone who's under 16, you're still responsible for their wellbeing.

What do the NSPCC recommend?

- Babies and toddlers should never be left alone.
- Children under 12 shouldn't be left home alone for long
- Children under 16 shouldn't be left alone overnight and children over 16
 years shouldn't be left alone frequently for long periods of time or for multiple nights.
- Children should never be left in a home that could put them at risk- like with no electricity or heat, or with dangerous objects.

What is Neglect?

If a parent or carer fails to meet a child's basic needs, such as food and warm clothing, **or constantly leaves a child alone**, this is known as neglect. Neglect is as serious as other forms of child abuse because the effects on children can be just as damaging and long-lasting.





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
Our breakfast club is open from 7.45 am every school day. Please contact the office if you'd like to book a space for your child.
